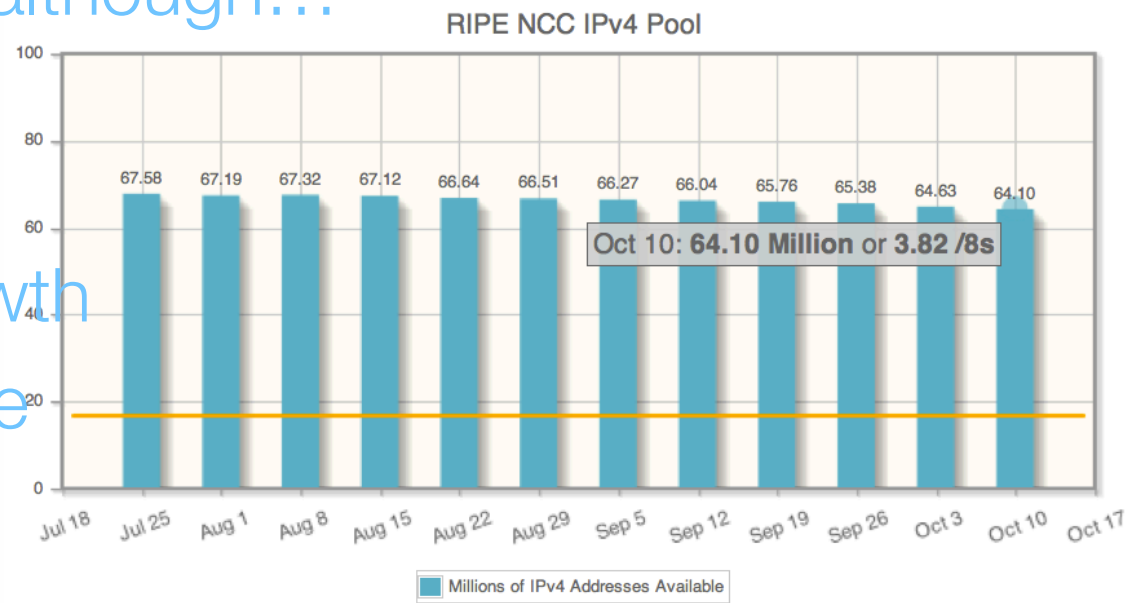

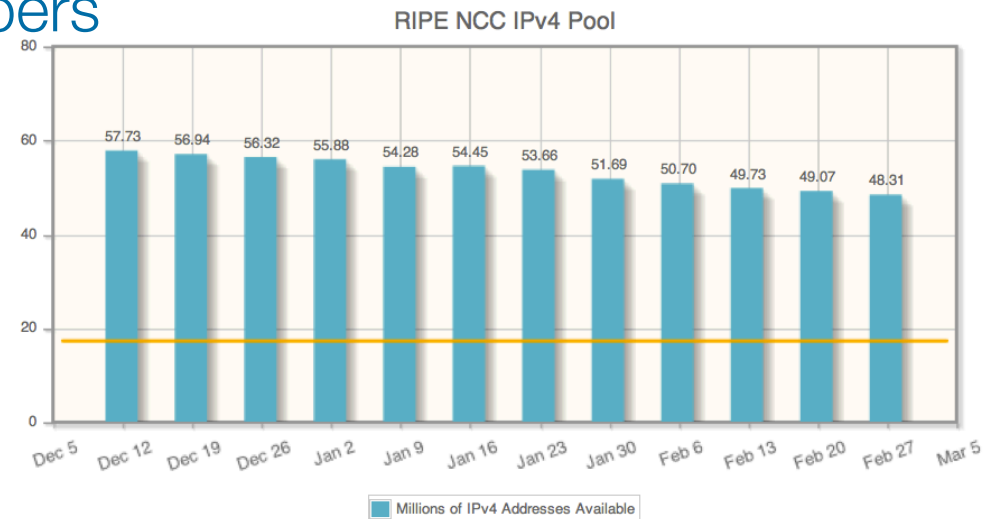
Operations: Registration Services Changes

- Allocations now for three months only
- Servicing requests:
Clarifications go back to end of waitlist...
- High ticket load, although...
 - Pronounced summer hole
- Membership growth significantly above budget



Registration Services: Calm and Prepared

- Allocations for three months only
- IPv4 addresses left for “a couple of months”
- Servicing requests:
Clarifications go back to end of waitlist...
 - Well accepted by members
- 2011 Membership growth highest since 2008, now 7885



From APNIC 32: Certification – The Discussion

- Early attempts in Lisbon, October 2009
 - Focus on business impact, policies
- Deployment 2011
 - Ca. 600 members requested certificates
- Discussion of Principles and Dangers in May 2011
 - Clear concerns about “Red Button” and related impact on routing system
 - Retraction of Certification Policy Proposal
- Way forward
 - More presentations & discussion at next RIPE Meeting
 - General Meeting

Certification – What Happened

- Clear indication of definitely no clear consensus among members and community
- Panel and discussion during RIPE Vienna on technology risks and benefits
- Resolution among members at General Meeting: Stop / Continue without ROAs / Continue as before
- Implementation continues, full authority for depending parties is implemented in validator tool

From APNIC32: Preserving Financial Stability

- A New Charging Scheme is needed
 - Current scheme based on (mostly IPv4-) allocations
- Propose to set Fee proportional to Benefit
 - How to measure “benefit from RIPE NCC services”?
- Proposal published
- Feedback from members-discuss mailinglist
 - Smaller jumps, Sliding scale, ...
- Adjusted model
 - to be formally adopted during General Meeting

2012 Charging Scheme – What Happened

- Proposal for 2012 Charging Scheme based on membership discussions and comments
- ... Failed at the General Meeting
- Criticism: Too much change too late in the year
- Running on “old” 2011 Charging Scheme now
- Task Forces are great...
- Charging Scheme Task Force to work on and propose Principles in time for General Meeting in April
 - All member categories, board, represented

Member & Stakeholder Survey

- Fifth survey done in 2011
- 825 responses, most so far
- No drastic surprises. Good!
- Overall satisfaction rate 5.96 out of 7
 - Registration Services: 6.44 / 7

- However:

“A common thread that emerged through the survey was that the RIPE NCC should find ways to involve RIPE NCC members and other stakeholders who currently do not participate in RIPE community discussions or activities, whether through lack of interest, awareness or knowledge.”

So What Shall We Do?

Action areas

The lower rated areas received ratings in the region 4 to 5. The rating scale used was 1 to 7, so even these lower rated areas attracted strong support from a large section of the membership and stakeholders. However, improvement in the following areas and, in many cases, stepping up efforts to promote them, were requested:

- Network measurements and statistics
- Outreach activities
- RPKI – Certification
- Geolocation
- TTM
- Secondary DNS

In particular, the scores for network measurements and statistics are relatively low but still positive; and the RIS measurements score among the top 10. This, and other results from the survey, confirm that tools need to be easier to find, use and correlate with each other.
