 Status: Closed. The APNIC 32 Policy SIG resolved prop-69 be abandoned. On 3 November 2011, the APNIC EC acknowledged prop-069 is superseded by prop-097, "Global Policy for post exhaustion IPv4 allocation mechanisms by the IANA" and should be abandoned.
